- **The 7-Day Trade Hold (2018 ):** To curb immediate skin-transferring utilized by automated gambling bots, Valve made traded products untradeable for one week. While this hurt legitimate traders, it dealt an enormous blow to the instant-deposit design of CSGO casinos.

In spite of these steps, the underground economy remains resistant, with operators pivoting to peer-to-peer (P2P) trading systems and cryptocurrency combination to bypass conventional trade constraints.
