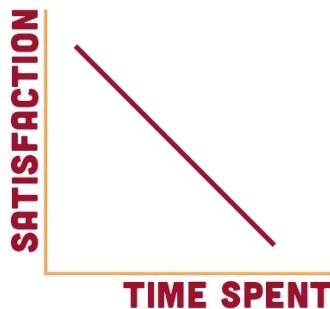
Wedding > Divorce
