Why rekeying makes sense

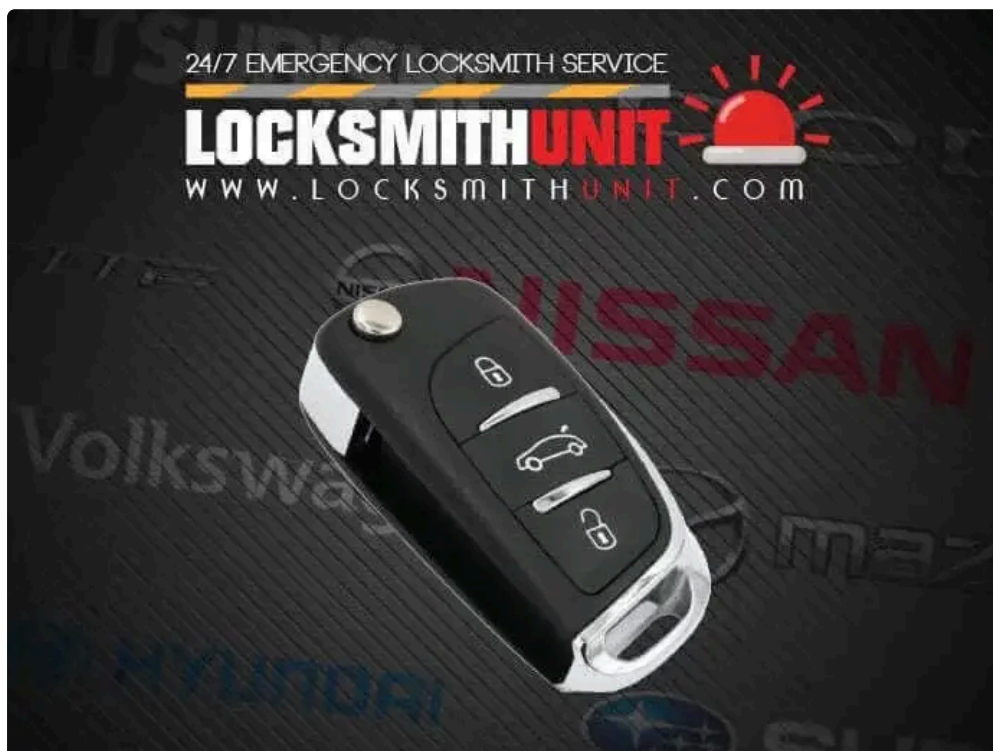
