Coinflip	A direct 1v1 player-versus-player game where two users bet skins of equal value on a digital coin toss. Low (Platform takes a small portion charge)
Jackpot	Several gamers deposit skins into a communal pot. A winner is drawn based upon the percentage of their contribution. Low (Platform commission)
Plinko/ Mines	Casual arcade-style gambling games adapted from timeless video game shows and puzzle ideas. Medium

How the CS2 Gambling Ecosystem Works

To understand how a CS2 casino functions, one should look at the technical pipeline that permits virtual items to be converted into gambling capital and back into cash.

1. Steam API and Peer-to-Peer (P2P) Trading
