How to Get CS2 Cases

Players can acquire cases primarily through active gameplay, trading, or purchasing them directly. Valve utilizes a particular drop system to regulate the supply of cases in the environment.

The Weekly Drop System

Weekly, active-duty players who level up their profile receive a care package where they can choose 2 benefits out of four alternatives, which sometimes includes a weapon case. Furthermore, gamers can receive random drops at the end of matches on main servers.

Active Duty vs. Rare Drop Pools

Valve categorizes cases into 2 primary swimming pools:

- **Active Drop Pool:** These cases drop often to gamers presently playing the video game. They normally represent the most just recently launched collections.
- **Rare (Discontinued) Drop Pool:** These older cases no longer drop routinely after matches. Instead, they have an infinitesimally small chance of dropping (roughly a 1% possibility compared to active drops), triggering their market price to appreciate over time.

- **Classified (Pink):** 3.20%
- **Covert (Red):** 0.64%
- **Special Item (Knives/ Gloves):** 0.26% (approximately a 1 in 385 opportunity)

Furthermore, every product unpacked has a chance to come in a particular **wear condition**, varying from *Factory New* to *Battle-Scarred*. Some products also have a little opportunity of being **StatTrak™**, which tracks the variety of eliminates made with that specific weapon.
