

A breaker that keeps tripping often needs replacement, but before you call for a simple swap, understand that this is your electrical system signaling it cannot handle current demand—especially if you're planning to add an EV charger. Does Your Home's Electrical System Need Upgrades to Safely Install an EV Charger

When a breaker trips repeatedly, it's protecting your wiring from overload by shutting off power. This is exactly what it should do. However, if your panel is already strained by everyday loads—kitchen appliances, HVAC, water heater—adding a 240V EV charger that draws 30 to 60 amps will demand far more than your current infrastructure can deliver. Understanding Panel Capacity Before You Install an EV Charger

Your electrical panel is the heart of power distribution to your home. If your breaker is tripping, the panel may be undersized for your combined loads. A 100-amp service, common in homes built in the mid-20th century, was designed for electric resistance heating and basic appliances—not modern demand. Adding an EV charger typically requires a minimum 200-amp panel and often a 400-amp service in homes throughout Automobile Alley and Capitol Hill where we serve families planning electrification. How Breaker Replacement Fits Into Your EV Charger Project Timeline

If a single breaker has failed—burned contacts, internal wear—replacement alone may restore that circuit. The reason is straightforward: a failing panel is a liability. During the planning phase for your charger, we assess whether any breakers show age, corrosion, or repeated failures. A replacement breaker costs far less than a full panel upgrade, but it only makes sense if the panel itself has adequate total capacity.
