Armor and Protection

Typical Armor Sets

- **Burlap/ Leather Set:** Early game protection; simple to craft, provides very little defense against firearms, but good versus cold and wildlife.
- **Road Sign/ Wolf Headdress Set:** Mid-game meta. Balances movement speed with trustworthy bullet defense.
- **Metal Facemask/ Metal Chest Plate:** The gold standard for late-game PvP. Combined with a hoodie and pants, this package offers maximum security against raids and strolling teams.

Raiding Tools and Explosives

If developing a fortress is half the fight, tearing down someone else's is the other half. The Rust Items Wiki provides exact explosive estimations, assisting raiding celebrations determine the number of resources they need to breach a base's honeycomb walls.

- **Pouch Charges:** Unreliable, unstable, however low-cost for mid-game raids.
