- **How it works:** Multiple players deposit skins into a cumulative pot. Each skin contributes tickets based on its dollar worth. A random draw chooses a winner, where a greater overall contribution yields a greater analytical chance of winning the whole pot.
- **Appeal:** The ultimate "high-roller" video game mode, where single fortunate winners can walk away with countless dollars in rare digital items.

The Economics of Skin Trading and Withdrawal
