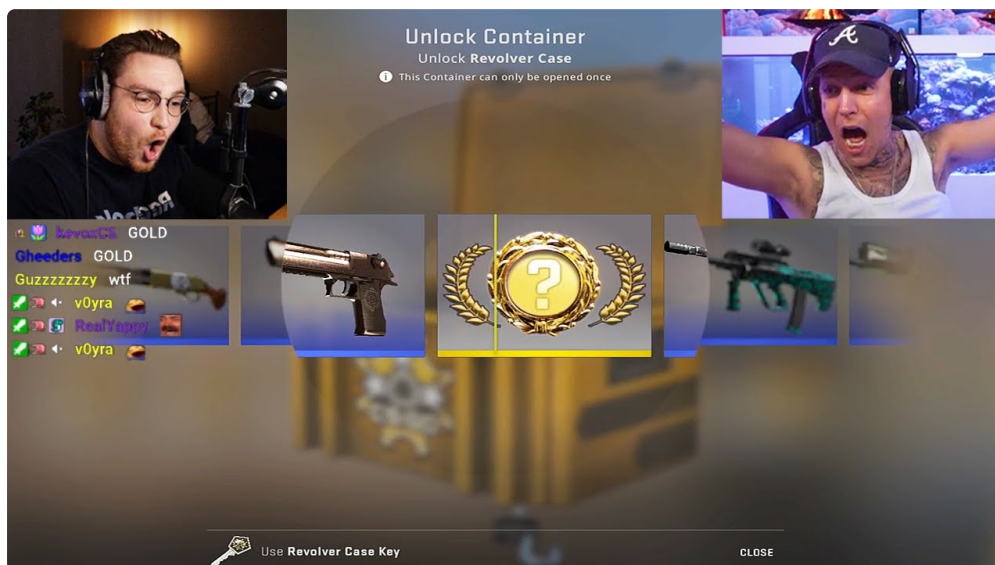

Vital Safety Checklist

- **Beware of "Admin" Impostors:** Scammers regularly include players on Steam pretending to be website staff offering "rigged wins" or totally free balance. Genuine personnel will never ever message you initially.
- **Safeguard Your API Key:** Never log into unknown third-party trading sites or input your Steam API key, as this can result in stock hijacking.
- **Enable Steam Guard:** Ensure your mobile authenticator is active to secure your account from unapproved trade offers.
