Does manufacturer coverage matter more than equipment age when deciding between repair and replacement?

When you purchase a new system, it typically includes a manufacturer's warranty covering parts for 5 to 10 years and labor coverage ranging from 1 to 5 years, depending on the brand and installer. As your system approaches its 10th year, parts warranties begin expiring, and by year 12 to 15, most original coverage has completely lapsed. This timing is crucial because a system still under warranty can often be economically repaired, while one past its coverage window may justify replacement instead. What information should you gather about your current system's warranty?

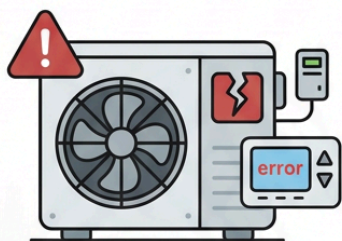
