Preparing Electronics Before Packing

Back up important data before moving day, whether through cloud storage or an external hard drive kept separate from the moving truck. Take photos of cable setups behind computers and monitors to make reconnecting equipment easier at the new location.

Using the Right Materials for Monitors and Screens

Monitors and television screens require anti-static bubble wrap rather than standard packing materials, since regular bubble wrap can create static electricity that damages sensitive screens. Original boxes, if still available, provide the best fit and protection for monitors and computer towers.

Packing Computer Towers and Peripherals

Remove any loose components such as memory cards or external drives before packing a computer tower. Wrap the tower in anti-static material and place it in a well-cushioned box that limits movement during transport. Keyboards, mice, and cables can be bundled together in labeled bags to keep them organized for setup at the new location.

Handling Printers and Other Office Equipment

Remove ink or toner cartridges from printers before the move to prevent leaks during transport. Secure any moving parts, such as paper trays, with tape to prevent them from shifting or opening inside the box.

Loading Electronics Safely on the Truck

Electronics should be loaded last and positioned upright rather than on their sides whenever possible, since certain components can be damaged by prolonged sideways positioning. Keeping these items away from heavier furniture during transport also reduces the risk of accidental impact.



Setting Up at the New Location

Unpack electronics as early as possible after arrival, allowing devices to reach room temperature before powering them on, especially after transport during extreme weather. Referencing the photos taken beforehand makes reconnecting cables straightforward.
