Understanding Wear Ratings and Float Values

One of the most interesting elements of CS2 skins is the wear system. Unlike many games where products look identical, CS2 uses a numerical metric called a **Float Value** (ranging from 0.00 to 1.00) to determine how scratched, worn, or faded a skin appears.

Outside Condition Float Value Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, perfect finish with very little to no noticeable scratches. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Extremely minor signs of wear, usually visible just on close assessment. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Noticeable scratches and endure popular edges and paint surfaces. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Substantial wear, heavy scratching, and dulled colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Extreme wear, rusted metal, greatly broke paint, and distressed visual appeals.

Note: Some skins are "float-capped," indicating they can not physically drop in Factory New condition, making their least expensive offered wear condition exceptionally important.

The CS2 economy operates much like a real-world stock exchange. Rates change based upon supply, demand, gamer count, professional esports competitions, and Valve updates.

Why Are Some Skins Worth So Much?
