First, a quick reality check: **RTP is a long-term average, not a snapshot of your short-term gaming session.** For example, a slot game with a 96% RTP means that over millions of spins, you can expect to lose £4 for every £100 wagered on average. But your actual session could be wildly different due to variance—sometimes you win big; sometimes you lose a lot.

Typical UK RTP Ranges and High-Return Slots

In the UK market, typical RTP rates vary:

- Standard slots usually offer between 94% to 96% RTP.
- Bingo games tend to have slightly lower RTPs, often in the 85%-95% range, factoring in prize pools and ticket structures.
- Anything above 97% is generally considered high-return and quite player-friendly.

The Commission mandates that RTP information is made easily accessible, ideally directly from the game interface via an information panel or immediate help icon.

MRQ bingo and slots typically provide this info within the game, so you won't need to dig through FAQ pages or external documents. That said, always verify RTP figures before committing your bankroll. This quick check saves you from unknowingly playing games with unfavourable odds or ambiguous bonus terms.

Bonus Offers and Hidden Terms: A Warning

Be cautious about bonus offers that appear attractive but come with vague or hidden terms.
