- **Match Betting:** Wagering skins or currency on professional esports matches (ESL Pro League, Majors, etc) based upon real-time odds.

2. **Customer Seed:** The player's web browser produces a random seed, or the gamer can input their own.
3. **The Outcome:** The server seed and customer seed are integrated utilizing a cryptographic algorithm to create the video game result.
4. **Verification:** After the video game concludes, the unhashed server seed is revealed. Gamers can plug the data into a third-party calculator to show the result wasn't altered in real time.
