

Traffic across the Washington metro region can add significant time to a move if not planned around carefully. Understanding Peak Traffic Patterns in the Region

Weekday mornings between 7 and 9:30 and weekday afternoons between 4 and 6:30 see the heaviest congestion across major routes connecting Rockville, Bethesda, DC, and Northern Virginia. Interstate 270, the Capital Beltway, and major arteries into downtown DC are particularly congested during these windows. Scheduling a move outside these hours reduces the time spent in transit between locations.

Choosing the Right Day of the Week

Midweek moves, particularly Tuesday through Thursday, often see lighter overall traffic than Mondays or Fridays, when commuter volume tends to be higher. Weekend moves avoid the standard weekday commute but can face different congestion near shopping districts and event venues, depending on the specific neighborhood.

How Bulldog Movers Plans Around Traffic

Starting Early to Avoid Midday Congestion

Beginning a move earlier in the morning, before the height of rush hour traffic, often allows the truck to reach the new location before congestion builds later in the day. This is particularly useful for moves crossing between Maryland, DC, and Virginia, where bridges and major routes see consistent slowdowns during standard commute hours.

Planning for Construction and Road Closures

Ongoing construction projects throughout the region can add unexpected delays beyond typical rush hour patterns. Checking regional traffic and construction alerts a day or two before the move helps identify any detours that may affect the planned route.



Communicating Timing Expectations With Your Movers
