

What Does Garage Door Repair Usually Include?

Garage door repair can involve more than simply replacing a damaged part. A technician may check the entire **overhead garage door**, identify the cause of the problem, and operate the door after performing the work. Common services include servicing or replacing springs, cables, rollers, hinges, tracks, brackets, weather seals, and other **garage door hardware**.

A repair visit may also address the **garage door opener**. If the garage door will not open, the problem could be a failed motor, damaged drive system, faulty wall switch, dead remote control battery, disconnected power, or misaligned safety sensor. The opener should be examined together with the door because an opener can become overloaded when the door is unbalanced or binding.
