*Note: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not drop in Factory New condition, making lower-float variations exceedingly unusual and costly.*

# Rarity Tiers and Finishes

Skins are classified into various rarity tiers, which determine their drop rates in [CS2 Gambling Site](#) cases and general eminence.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, standard drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less typical low-tier items.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard weapon surfaces discovered in many cases.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Higher-tier weapons, frequently utilized in trade-ups.
