* The "Rare Item Drop Rate" represents the opportunity that the RNG will award a "Rare" (Gold) item, which can be a knife, glove, or stat-trak variation of a high-tier skin. The specific likelihood for each specific skin within that tier is a different, undisclosed calculation.

The table demonstrates that while many cases cost only a couple of dollars, the probability of landing a high-value skin stays extremely low. Players should for that reason view case opening as a kind of entertainment rather than a trusted investment.

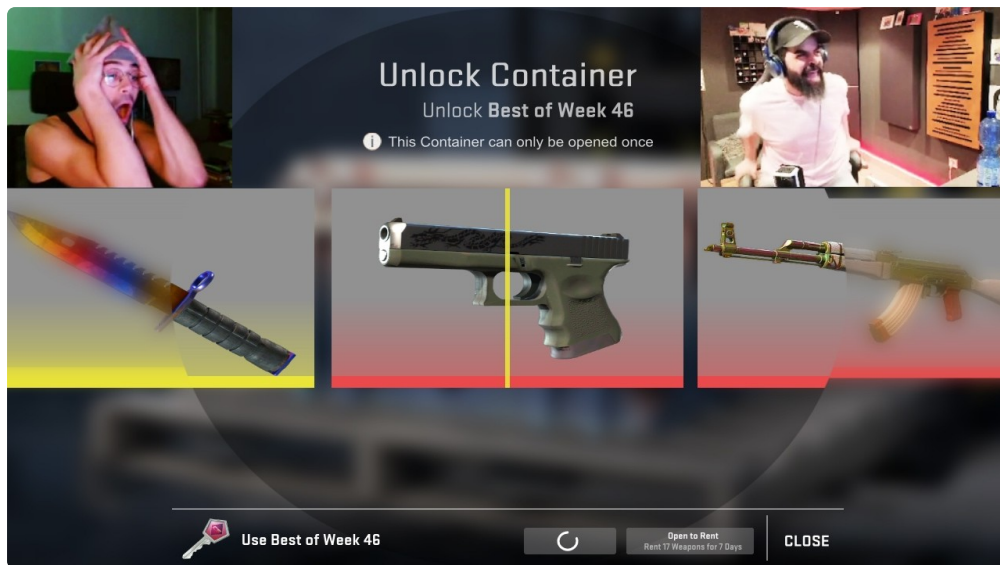
