

2-Car Garage Door Pricing in Los Angeles

A typical 2-car garage door in Los Angeles usually measures approximately 16 feet wide by 7 feet high, although some homes use an 18-foot-wide opening or custom dimensions. The final price depends on the door material, insulation, windows, hardware, opener, removal of the old door, and installation conditions.
