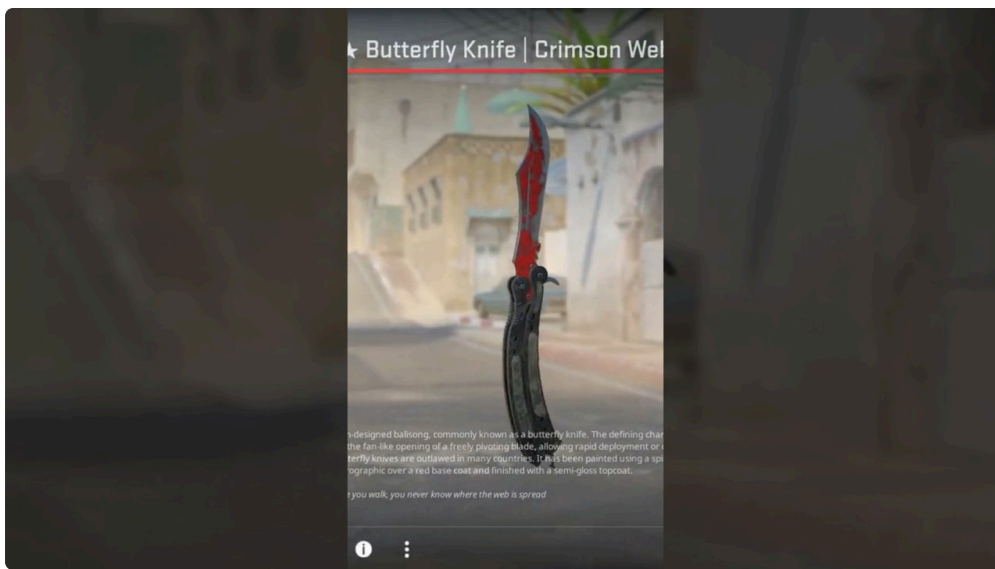

3. Drop Rates and Probabilities

The official drop likelihoods (as published by Valve) for each rarity in a basic CS2 case are:



Rarity Approximate Drop Rate Mil-Spec (Blue) 79.92% Restricted (Purple) 15.98% Classified (Pink) 3.20% Covert (Red) 0.64% Rare Special Item (Gold) -- Knife **0.25%**
