Typical Causes and Their Solutions

Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Guide

If you are experiencing repeating crashes, work through the following troubleshooting steps systematically.

1. Verify the Integrity of Game Files

Over time, game files can become damaged due to unexpected system shutdowns, insufficient updates, or defective storage drives. Steam has an integrated tool to inspect and change missing out on or broken files.

- Open the **Steam Library**.
- Right-click on **CS: GO** and select **Properties**.
- Navigate to the **Local Files** tab.
- Click **Verify Integrity of Game Files**.
- Wait on the process to finish (Steam will instantly download any damaged files), then restart your computer.

2. Update or Roll Back Graphics Drivers

Your graphics card chauffeur is the bridge between your hardware and CS: GO. Outdated or corrupted motorists are a primary source of game instability.

- **NVIDIA Users:** Open GeForce Experience or go to the official NVIDIA site to download the latest Game Ready Driver.
- **AMD Users:** Use the AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition to look for updates.
- *Pro Tip:* If the crashes began instantly after a motorist update, use a tool like **Display Driver Uninstaller (DDU)** in Safe Mode to entirely clean the old motorist before installing a steady, older version.

3. Change Launch Options

- Go to your Steam Library, right-click **CS: GO**, and select **Properties**.
- Under the **General** tab, look for **Launch Options**.

4. Run the Game as Administrator

- Find the primary executable file (csgo.exe).

- Go to the **Compatibility** tab and examine **Run this program as an administrator**.
- Click Apply and OK.

5. Inspect for Background Application Interference

Overlay software application and hardware tracking tools often hook into the DirectX pipeline of games, which can cause sudden crashes. Attempt disabling the following applications while playing:

- Discord Overlay
- NVIDIA GeForce Experience Overlay
- RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS) and MSI Afterburner
- Third-party anti-viruses software (attempt including an exclusion for the Steam folder)

Advanced Troubleshooting

If standard fixes fail to resolve the problem, the problem might lie deeper within your operating system or hardware setup.

1. Handling Overclocks and XMP Profiles

While overclocking your CPU, GPU, or RAM supplies an efficiency boost, CS: GO is infamously conscious hardware instability.

- If you have used an aggressive overclock, attempt calling it back to baseline factory requirements.
- If you are running high-speed RAM, test disabling your motherboard's **XMP (Extreme Memory Profile)** or **DOCP** in the BIOS to see if memory instability is triggering the crashes.

2. Re-installing CS: GO Cleanly

In some cases, remaining custom-made maps, out-of-date workshop items, or heavily modified setup files cause relentless disputes.

- Uninstall CS: GO through Steam.
- By hand navigate to the setup directory site (... steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive) and erase any staying folders.
- Re-install a fresh copy of the game.

Preventative Maintenance Checklist

To decrease the chances of future crashes destroying your video gaming sessions, keep this fast maintenance checklist in mind:

- **Keep Windows Updated:** Install the current cumulative updates for your os.
