- **Appeal:** Simple rules and familiar mechanics draw in casual and veteran bettors alike.

4. Jackpot/ Pot Games

- **How it works:** Multiple gamers deposit skins into a cumulative pot. Each skin contributes tickets based on its dollar worth. A random draw picks a winner, where a higher total contribution yields a higher statistical chance of winning the entire pot.
- **Appeal:** The ultimate "high-roller" video game mode, where single lucky winners can leave with thousands of dollars in unusual digital products.
