Gamers used secrets almost like a secondary currency-- trading them among themselves for skins, games, and third-party money without ever opening a single case.

Crook networks and carders exploited this liquidity by purchasing keys with stolen credit funds, trading them instantly, and cashing out. To fight this, **Valve made all recently bought secrets untradeable and unmarketable**.

This single upgrade caused a massive shockwave in the trading community, permanently separating "investable skins" from "functional keys."

Types of Keys in Counter-Strike

Not all keys are developed equal. Over the years, Valve presented a number of variations of keys connected to specific collections or occasions.

1. Standard Case Keys

Purchased directly from the in-game store for £ 2.50. These can open the huge bulk of basic weapon cases currently dropping in the video game.

2. Operation Keys

Throughout particular operations (like Operation Hydra, Breakout, or Wildfire), Valve released operation-specific cases together with devoted operation keys. When the operation ended, these secrets typically kept their functionality for their specific cases, ending up being collector's items.

3. Esport Keys

5. What happens to secrets if I erase them?

If you delete a key from your stock, it is completely damaged. Valve will not restore erased items, so workout extreme care when handling your stock.
