Valve classifies cases into 2 distinct groups that dictate their rarity and drop frequency:

Pool Type	Description	Drop Frequency	Example Cases
Active Drop Pool	Cases currently dropping to players actively playing on official and neighborhood servers.	Typical (Weekly drops)	Kilowatt Case, Recoil Case, Gallery Case
Unusual Drop Pool	Stopped cases that no longer drop routinely as end-of-match rewards.	Exceptionally Rare (approx. <<1% opportunity)	CS: GO Weapon Case, Chroma Case, Gamma Case

2. Anatomy of a Case Opening: What are the Odds?

Opening a CS2 case needs two things: the case itself and a corresponding **Key** (bought in-game for £ 2.50 GBP). When integrated, the case spins through a randomized series before landing on a weapon finish.

Valve does not officially publish precise portions for every [Case Opening](#) single drop, however substantial community data mining and massive sample openings have supplied a clear analytical image of case odds.

Estimated CS2 Case Probabilities

- **Mil-Station (Blue):** ~ 79.92%
- **Restricted (Purple):** ~ 15.98%

- **Classified (Pink):** ~ 3.2%
- **Covert (Red):** ~ 0.64%
- **Special Item/ Rare (Gold/ Knives & & Gloves):** ~ 0.26%

* Note: There is an additional ~ 10% possibility that any weapon skin dropped will feature **StatTrak™**, which tracks validated kills with that specific weapon. *
