The Kelly Criterion is a formula used to determine the optimum size of a series of bets to make the most of the expected logarithm of wealth.

- **The Formula:**  $f^* = \frac{bp - q}{b}$ 
  - $f^*$  = % of the bankroll to wager
  - $b$  = decimal chances minus 1
  - $p$  = possibility of winning
  - $q$  = possibility of losing ( $1 - p$ )
- **Application:** Most casual gamblers utilize a "Fractional Kelly" (e.g., wagering just 25% of what the formula recommends) to minimize volatility.
