

Garage door repair cost in Los Angeles varies according to the problem, the door's size and material, the hardware involved, and whether service is needed during regular hours or as emergency garage door repair. A simple adjustment may cost considerably less than replacing a broken spring, damaged garage door panel, opener, or an entire overhead garage door.
