1. **Clear the Area:** Keep kids and animals far from the space.

4. **Cover the Opening:** Use heavy-duty plastic sheeting or a thick garbage bag, secured with duct tape or painter's tape, to seal the opening from wind, rain, and intruders.

- **Action 6: Applying the Final Seal:** A neat triangle of putty is used around the border of the glass, ravelled, and delegated treat before painting.
