- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, trying to ride a winning streak while keeping losses lessened to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the intent of holding out for huge multipliers (50x, 100x, or higher). This works much like playing the lotto.
