The very first time I watched a 70-foot silver maple come down in a tight urban backyard, the supervisor had a hand on the rope bag and his eyes on the wind. A word on electrical threats. Trees near service drops or primaries are not a routine trim. Just line-clearance certified arborists should work within the minimum method range of energized conductors. If power lines are in
