



Counter-Strike: Global Offensive (CS: GO) has always been a video game of continuous development, and the intro of brand-new weapon cases is one of the most noticeable methods Valve keeps the meta fresh. Notes:

- The "Covert" rarity is the rarest tier and constantly looks like the bonus item (knife or gloves).
- The percentages revealed are approximate and can shift a little with each case spot.
- Rates on the Steam Market often exceed the in-game cost for extremely sought-after skins.

3. Why These Cases Matter

3.1 Economy Influence

When a brand-new case launches, the marketplace responds within hours. The **Recoil Case**, for instance, drove the price of the *SCAR-20|Blueprint* (Mil-Spec) from £ 0.15 to £ 0.45 on the very first day.
