### 4. Use "Crazy Mode" Cautiously

Crazy Mode (where the most affordable overall worth wins) turns standard reasoning on its head. While it can be enjoyable, it relies totally on hitting low-cost, low-tier drops. Do not approach this mode with basic case-opening logic.
