(Note: Within each tier, there is also an approximate 10% opportunity that the weapon skin will include "StatTrak™" innovation, which tracks the number of eliminates made with that weapon.)

The StatTrak™ and Wear Factors

Beyond the base rarity, 2 extra variables dictate a skin's worth:

- **Float Value (Wear):** Every skin is appointed a float worth varying from 0.00 to 1.00, identifying its physical condition:
 - Factory New (FN)
 - Minimal Wear (MW)
 - Field-Tested (FT)
 - Well-Worn (WW)
 - Battle-Scarred (BS)
- **StatTrak™:** A small digital counter attached to the weapon body. These normally command a higher rate on the marketplace compared to their non-StatTrak equivalents.
