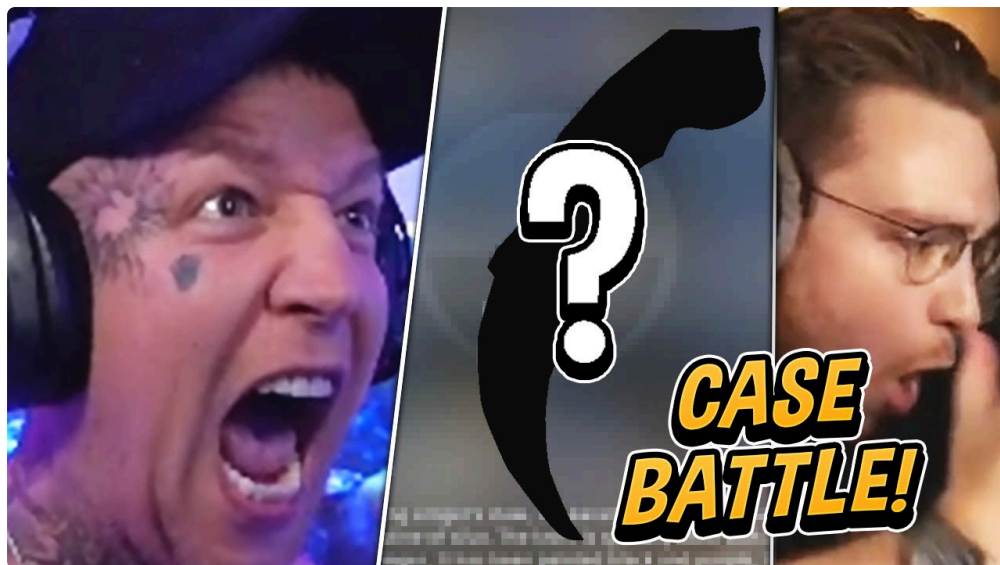
3. How to Join a Game Battle
