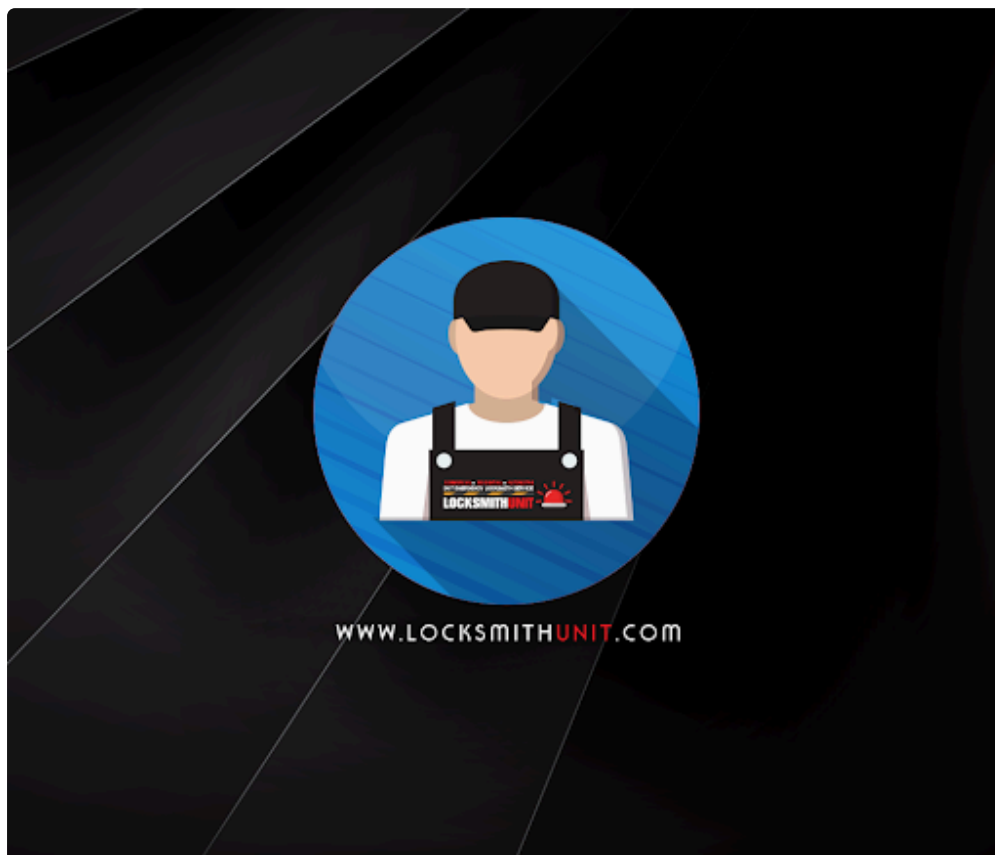

If the lock is damaged during the lockout, the job can expand into repair or replacement before the day is over.
