What Is the Commissioning Sequence for Safe Switch Integration?

Second, we remove the old switch and inspect the wire connections, junction box condition, and any signs of heat damage or corrosion. Third, we route the new switch into the box, connect the line, load, and ground conductors to the correct terminals, and make sure the box isn't overfilled—code requires proper fill ratios. Fourth, we secure the switch to the box, attach the cover plate, and restore power. Fifth, we test the switch under load and confirm all connected fixtures respond correctly.
