Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Really minor acnes, generally just noticeable upon close assessment.		
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious wear, scratches, and slight paint breaking on high-friction locations.		
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Substantial wear, fading colors, and prominent scratches.		
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Greatly distressed, rusted, or scraped away, frequently offering the weapon a gritty, commercial appearance.		

The CS2 Economy: Rarity Tiers

Skins are classified into different rarity tiers, which dictate their drop rates in-game or acquisition rates by means of weapon cases. Comprehending these tiers is necessary [CSGO Gambling Site](#) for anybody aiming to understand the market worth of their stock.

- **Customer Grade (White):** Common, fundamental weapon finishes, typically discovered in weekly gameplay drops.
