- **Regulative Ambiguity**-- Some jurisdictions deal with skin gambling as illegal, and platforms might limit gain access to based on place.

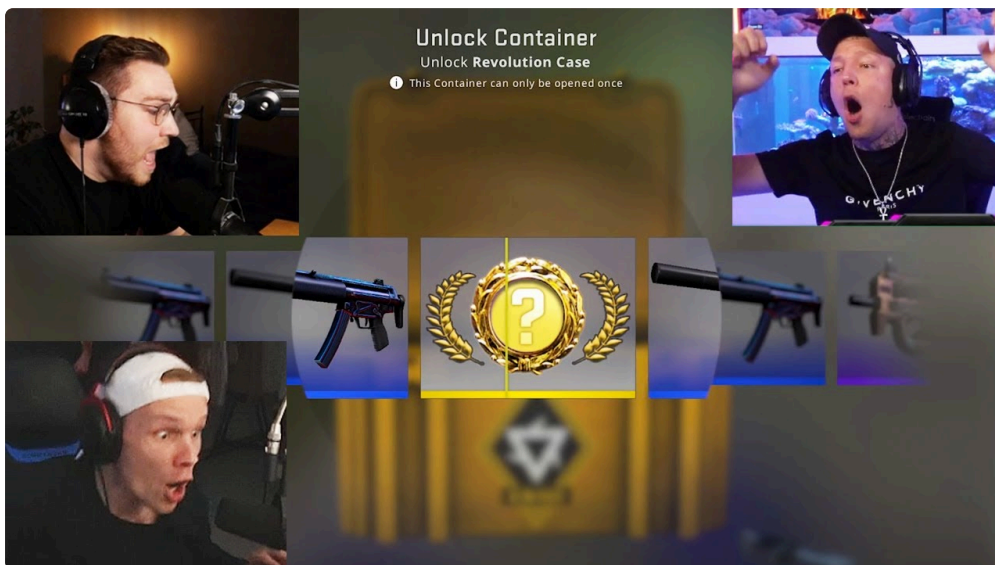
Best Practices for Safe Participation
