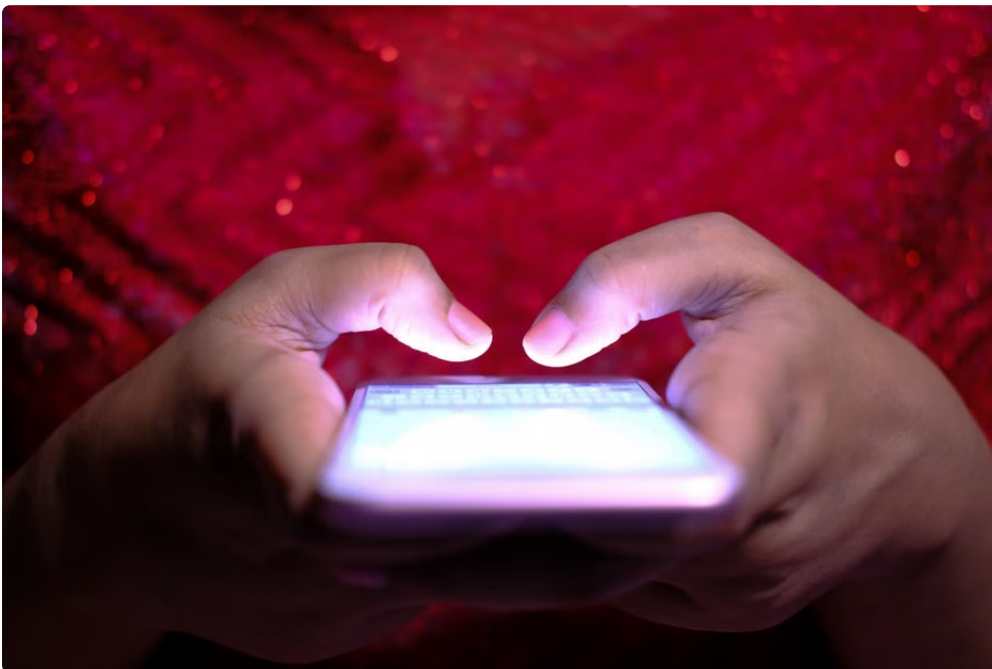
Catalogue Size vs Findability: Why More Isn't Always Better
