

Melville does not usually arrive on a travel bucket list with the drama of a beach town or the instant name recognition of a city neighborhood, and that is part of its appeal. It is a place that rewards attention rather than spectacle. Set in the heart of Suffolk County, Melville is the kind of Long Island community where business campuses sit near wooded preserves, where a good lunch spot matters more than flashy nightlife, and where a visitor who slows down a little starts to notice how thoughtfully the area is put together.
