

A local trend with a practical reason

Drive through any neighborhood around Greenville around the holidays and you will see it: houses lit cleanly along the roofline, with nobody's ladder in the yard. That is permanent outdoor lighting: an [permanent outdoor lighting](#) LED track installed once along the roofline, controlled from a phone.

What it does the rest of the year

Christmas gets people to pick up the phone. What makes it worth the money is everything after December. A warm white line along the roof makes the house easy to see from the road, which matters more on the county roads than it does downtown. Then there are team colors, birthdays and whatever the season asks for, all on the same track.

The local part matters

Upstate houses are not all one thing, and the design should not be either. Weather is the other local factor: the systems live outside through Upstate summers and wet winters.

From call to install

It starts with somebody coming out to look at the house. Somebody looks at the house and asks how you use the outside of it, then the plan gets built for that roofline. The install is handled by the crew, which is the part most people are really buying.

Not only houses

The same systems go on commercial buildings. Lighting a facade in the company's colors makes a building legible from a distance. Restaurant patios, retail entries, commercial facades and neighborhood entrances all get the same treatment. Scheduling works around when a business is open, since the entrance has to stay clear.

What Upstate customers ask most

Everybody asks about the summer months first. Color matched track along the trim line is the answer, and in daylight most people have to be shown where it is. People ask how it reads next to the neighbors. The setting is yours: warm white looks like architectural lighting and nothing else. Color is available when you want it, and unused the rest of the year. The service area runs past the state line. The coverage spans the Upstate and Western North Carolina, so it is worth asking even if you are outside Greenville County. If you are not sure whether your address is in it, the fastest answer is a phone call.

What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
