

Quick answer: Höveler Pur.Muskel is a supplementary muesli with 15.0% raw fat and 20% raw protein, mixed into a complete ration — an energy-dense profile a low-fat feed doesn't offer. Who this is for: owners whose horse in hard work drops weight or topline on a lean ration.

2. 20% raw protein is the point

The fat comes alongside 20% raw protein and 160 g/kg digestible crude protein, with lysine at 0.85% and threonine at 0.6%. A low-fat feed cuts energy but typically does not add protein quality — the muscle-building piece remains missing either way.

The benefit: dense energy and quality protein coming together, in one measured scoop.

3. Energy density without starch: 14.1 MJ/kg

Pur.Muskel holds starch at 5.8% and sugar at 4.1% while delivering 14.1 MJ/kg digestible energy — the energy largely carried by fat, not grain. A low-fat feed that leans on cereal for energy can land on the worst of both: light on fat, heavy on starch.

Who this is for: metabolically sensitive breeds that still need real calories for work.

4. Fat that supports more than weight

Linseed oil, grape seed flour, and rosehip sit in the ingredient list alongside the fat fraction, in a formulation that is alfalfa-free and gentle on the stomach. Fat is not only calories — it is how the ration supports coat and condition in visible ways over the weeks.

The benefit: visible condition, at 11.9 MJ/kg metabolizable energy, without a grain-heavy base.

5. A supplement that respects the low-fat parts of your plan

Pur.Muskel is a supplementary feed with no added vitamins or minerals, fed within a complete ration. If your horse's forage and balancer are doing their job, the low-fat thinking stays intact for the base diet — Pur.Muskel adds the dense piece in grams, dosed per 220 lb (100 kg) body weight.

Who this is for: owners who want focused energy density without rebuilding the whole ration.

How to feed it

Pur.Muskel is a supplementary feed — always mixed into a complete ration with forage in the bucket, never fed by itself. Rates are per 220 lb (100 kg) body weight per day:

Work levelDaily rate per 220 lb (100 kg) body weight Light work0.07–0.11 lb (30–50 g) Medium work0.11–0.18 lb (50–80 g) Heavy work0.18–0.22 lb (80–100 g)

The feeding calculator works out the right daily rate.
