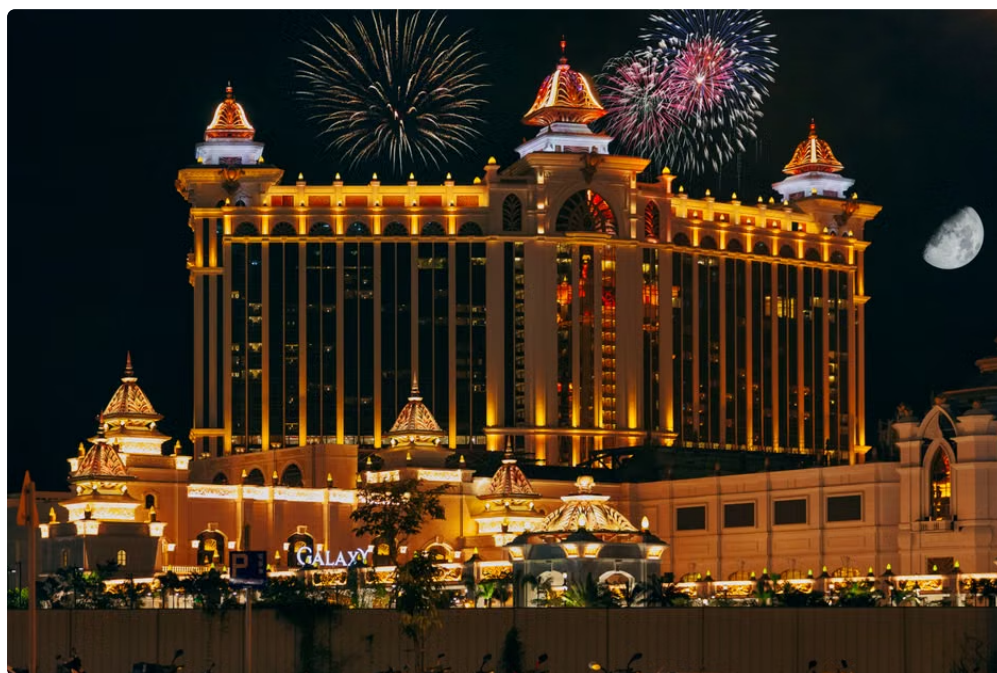
- Physical giveaways: branded merchandise, gadgets, or even luxury items.
