For non-EU/EEA license holders (e.g., USA, India, UK post-Brexit, Ukraine), the rules are more stringent:

- Licenses from countries that signed the **1968 Vienna Convention on Road Traffic** can usually be exchanged directly, though tests might be needed depending on bilateral arrangements and residency duration.
- Licenses from nations under the **1949 Geneva Convention** typically require passing the theoretical state exam.

Yes. A PESEL number (or an alternative tax identifier in specific short-term cases) is mandatory for producing your PKK profile and registering for examinations in Poland.
