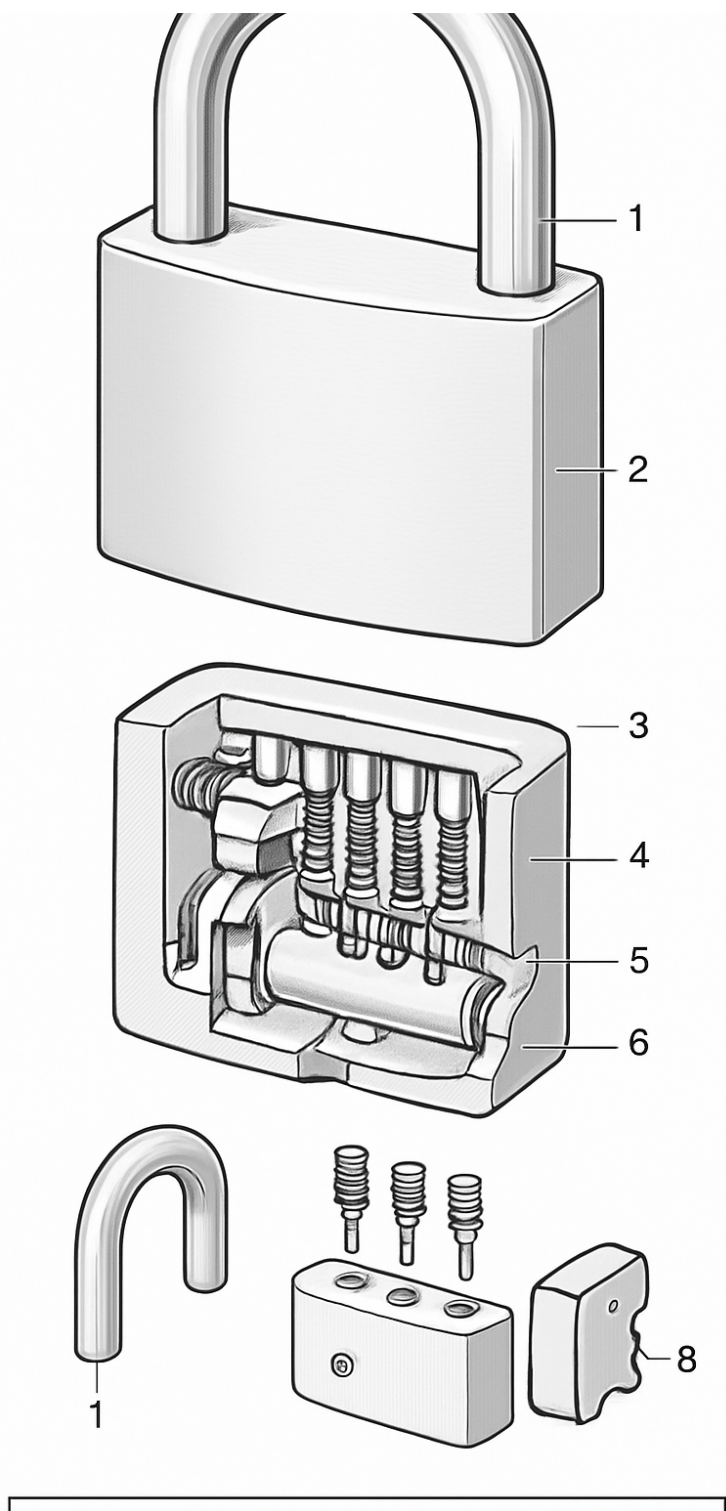
How to judge a best locksmith without overcomplicating it
