Browsing Weapon Categories

1. Melee Weapons

- **Rock:** The traditional starting tool.

3. Endgame Armaments (Tier 3)

Requiring a Level 3 Workbench and important elements, these weapons control open-field fights and base defense.

- **Attack Rifle (AK):** The gold standard of *Rust* PvP due to its high damage and flexibility.
- **Bolt Action Rifle:** Ideal for long-range scouting and roof-camping.
- **M249:** A terrible light gatling gun available just from Bradley APC or Helicopter cages.

Understanding Protection and Armor
