

Why this keeps coming up around Greenville

Drive through a Greenville neighborhood in December and you will see it: clean lines of color along the roof edge and not a strand in sight. That is permanent outdoor lighting: LEDs installed into the architecture of the house and run from an app.

What it means for an Upstate house

Holiday color is the reason most people call. The reason it sticks is what it does the rest of the year. A warm white line along the roof makes the house easy to see from the road, which matters on a long driveway or a dark street. Then there are team colors, birthdays and whatever the season asks for, all from the same system.

The local part matters

Around here you have everything from older homes near downtown to newer subdivisions in Greer, Simpsonville and Mauldin, so the design has to change house to house. Anything mounted on a roofline here has to survive the summer heat and the winter rain.

What the process is

It starts with a free consultation at your property. After the walkthrough, the design comes back custom to the property. Installation is professional, so nobody in the house goes up a ladder.

Commercial work around Greenville

The same systems work on businesses. Lighting a facade in brand colors does something a sign cannot do after dark. Restaurant patios, retail entries, commercial facades and community entries are all normal work. Scheduling works around when a business is open, because nobody wants a ladder at the front door during lunch.

Local questions that come up

The most common question around here is about the daytime look. Color matched track mounted tight to the fascia handles that, and from the street it reads as trim. The second question is about the neighborhood. A permanent system does not have to be loud. The color is a choice, not a default, which is why it works on a conservative street. The service area does not stop [permanent lighting installation evercrestlighting.com](https://www.evercrestlighting.com) at the state line. The coverage takes in both sides of the line, so it is worth asking even if you are outside Greenville County. If you are on the edge of that area, call and ask.

What is permanent outdoor lighting?

Permanent outdoor lighting is a fixed LED system installed along a building's roofline, eaves and architectural lines and left in place all year. The LEDs sit in a track that is color matched to the trim, and the system is controlled from a smartphone app. It replaces the seasonal strands that go up and come down each year.

Are the lights noticeable during the day?

The track is color matched to the trim or fascia and mounted tight along the edge of the roofline, so it is designed to stay discreet in daylight and read as part of the house rather than as decoration.

Does EverCrest Lighting install Christmas lights?

Yes. EverCrest Lighting installs Christmas and holiday lighting, and also installs permanent LED systems that handle holiday colors from an app. On traditional holiday lighting, EverCrest Lighting handles takedown at the end of the season and off season storage.
