Even the best mathematical strategy can crumble without proper mental discipline.

- **Tilt Management**-- After a losing streak, take a break. Continuing while annoyed often results in bigger losses.
- **Stop-Loss Limits**-- Decide in advance just how much you are prepared to lose in a single session (e.g., 10% of your bankroll).
- **Win-Goal Targets**-- Set a revenue objective (e.g., 5% of your bankroll) and stop as soon as it's reached.
