- **Standout Skins:** M4A1-S|Gamer Two, AK-47|Phantom Disruptor.
- **Why it's fantastic:** The M4A1-S|Gamer Two is a fan-favorite among players who choose spirited, lively styles over military-sim aesthetics. Combined with Horizon-series knives, it provides a fantastic balance of cost and visual appeal.

4. Operation Broken Fang Case

Operations constantly introduce renowned cases, and **Broken Fang** stands out due to its addition of agent skins (at the time) and high-demand weapon finishes.

- **Standout Skins:** M4A4|Cyber Security, AWP|Exoskeleton.
