

Airport drop-off charges have been quietly creeping up across UK airports over the past few years, catching many travellers off guard. The above table demonstrates how the standard free drop-off window usually *ranges around 10 to 15 minutes*. Exceeding this “grace period” means you’ll be charged a fee — often a flat rate around £5-£7. Some airports, particularly the busiest hubs like Heathrow and Edinburgh, offer the shortest free windows, while smaller airports may allow slightly longer.



What Does the "Free Drop-Off Window" Really Mean?

Airports use this free window to differentiate between quick drop-offs and longer waiting times or parking. The idea is you can pull up, unload luggage and passengers efficiently, then leave without charge within this timeframe.

- **Typical free times:** 10 to 15 minutes maximum at most UK airports
- **Variations:** Some smaller airports may not charge for up to 20 minutes, but these are exceptions
- **Charges begin:** Once you exceed the free window, fees apply automatically

2. **Free Alternatives:** Use Park & Ride or Long Stay free windows to avoid kerbside drop-off fees, but factor in shuttle time (often 10-20 minutes each way).

If you normally leave passengers standing on the kerb while you unload or wait, you'll probably exceed free time and get charged. Being efficient helps, but it's not always possible.
