1. Wear Ratings (Float Value)

Note: Some skins are "capped," indicating they can not exist in certain conditions (e.g., a skin may only generate approximately Minimal Wear).

2. StatTrak™ Technology

Skins with the StatTrak™ prefix function a little, radiant LED counter attached to the weapon body. This counter tracks the exact variety of eliminates the owner has actually secured with that particular weapon. As soon as geared up by another gamer, it briefly displays an "mistake" until gone back to the owner. StatTrak skins generally command a greater cost on the marketplace.

3. Memento Packages

Throughout Valve-sponsored Major competitions, viewers viewing by means of Steam or partnered streaming platforms can drop Souvenir Packages. Weapons inside these plans feature gold stickers commemorating the match, the teams, and the MVP of the round, making them highly collectible.

Rarity Tiers and Drop Rates

Skins are categorized into unique rarity tiers, which dictate how regularly they appear in weapon cases. The rarity color codes are generally acknowledged in the video gaming community:

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, basic weapon surfaces.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly superior to consumer grade.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard low-tier products found in cases.
- **Limited (Purple):** Mid-tier items; often utilized in trade-ups.
- **Categorized (Pink):** Highly desired, striking styles.
- **Covert (Red):** The highest basic weapon tier; incredibly rare.
- **Rare Special Item (Gold):** Knives and Gloves. The holy grail of unboxing.
